PSAT

Sophomores will take the PSAT test in the fall of their Sophomore year. The PSAT will be given during the morning of **Wednesday, October 24, 2018**, at Delta High School.

- This will serve as a practice for your Junior year PSAT scores which will determine National Merit Scholarship winners.
- PSAT scores can be used to qualify for Dual Credit opportunities.
- The PSAT Score Report will detail academic information and provide a great study tool for your Junior year PSAT and SAT.
- Sophomores take the PSAT free of charge! The Indiana Department of Education pays for you to take the test.
