Things to Know from the Front Office

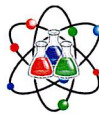
School starts at 8:40am and ends at 3:30pm

Students may sign themselves IN to the school, but need parent/guardian permission to sign themselves OUT. A **note or parent/guardian phone call in the morning** is what we need to give your student a pass to leave early from school. Students are required to be **here by 9:30 each day if they intend to participate in sports practices, events, or other extra-curricular events.**

Each student is allowed five parent written notes for illness per semester that are excused absences.

Student Drivers: Driving to school is a privilege, which can be taken away at the discretion of school administration. Students who would like to drive must register their car and obtain a parking pass at the beginning of each school year. This pass is \$3.00 and may be picked up in the main office. If that parking pass is lost then another pass must be purchased for \$5. This pass must be visible through the front windshield at all times.

After School Tutoring/Supervised Study Sessions

Students who need a place to do homework or complete projects after school are encouraged to attend the **Tuesday** Supervised Study Sessions in the library. These sessions begin at 3:30 and end promptly at 4:30. Each session will have a couple teachers (and potentially NHS students) who will help where they can, but the primary goal is to provide students with a calm, easily accessible work environment.

Students who do attend are expected to follow these rules:

1. SIGN IN AS YOU ARRIVE

Use the Chromebook at the counter to type in your name and what subject you plan to work on, then sit at the table with the sign that matches your subject.

2. CELL PHONES MUST BE PUT AWAY

Calculators are available on request.

3. THIS IS NOT A SOCIAL HOUR

Working together is encouraged, but your main priority is to get stuff done. Teachers are here to help you where they are able, so make sure you're using your time well.

4. THREE STRIKES, AND YOU'RE OUT

If your behavior is preventing others from working or you need to be constantly reminded to work, you will be given a warning. If you are warned again, your parents will be contacted. If you require a third warning, you will be asked to stop attending these study sessions.

5. SIGN OUT AS YOU LEAVE

Use the Chromebook again to sign out. Please make sure your ride knows to be here at 4:30.

Student Instructions for College Application Week

Congratulations! You are taking the first step necessary for going to college – applying! Be aware, there are several things you will need to do after today to complete the college application process. You will also have an opportunity to begin the process of submitting a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) which will help you determine the college financial aid you are eligible to receive.

Steps for Applying to College & Receiving Financial Aid

Step 1: If you think you qualify for an application fee waiver, talk to your school counselor. See the end of your College Application Week Worksheet for information on common fee waivers, or visit LearnMoreIndiana.org/college/applying-to-schools/#fee-header for more information.

Step 2: If you are applying online, go to LearnMoreIndiana.org/indiana-college-map or the college's admissions page (for out-of-state colleges). If you are not applying online, ask your counselor for assistance printing a paper copy of an application. Have your College Application Week Worksheet ready! (You should have completed this before this event.)

Step 3: Complete the application(s) to the colleges and universities to which you want to apply.

Step 4: Make note of any additional items you need to submit with your application (essay, transcripts, SAT or ACT scores, recommendation letters).

Step 5: Save a copy or print out a copy of your confirmation page if you applied online. If you are applying through a paper application, make a copy of your application. Keep the confirmation page or a copy of the application for your records.

Step 6: Register for your FSA ID – you will need this to complete your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. Many grants, loans and scholarships will require that you submit a FAFSA so this is a very important step. Go here to register for your FSA ID: <https://fsaid.ed.gov>.

You will need your Social Security Number (SSN), your address and an email address to complete the process. **REMEMBER your FSA ID and answers to the security questions.** Write them down if necessary.

Step 7: Complete the student sign-out sheet before you leave the College Application Week event. You will need to list the colleges you applied to and whether you completed the FSA ID process.

Step 8: Follow-up! Make sure you submit any additional information the colleges you applied to require. This could include recommendation letters, test scores and high school transcripts. Also, the next important step in the process is completing your FAFSA. You already have your FSA ID, make sure you submit your FAFSA between October 1 and April 15. Be on the lookout for FAFSA filing events at your school and in your community and visit FAFSA.gov to get started.
