Finals December 15-20

With a parent note, students may be excused from school when they do not have a final exam.

Students can not come and go in between finals(during the school day), even with a note.

These are **not considered absences**, so students may participate in extracurricular activities on those days.

For Example, if a student has an exam both in the morning AND in the afternoon, they must be here all day, they cannot leave in between exams.

If a student has a morning final only, with a Parent WRITTEN note they may leave after that final.

If a student has an afternoon final ONLY, with a parent WRITTEN note, they may come to school just before the final.

ONCE the Final exam has STARTED, the classroom cannot be interrupted, and the students may NOT leave the classroom until the Exam period is over.



BSU DUAL CREDIT INFORMATION

Seniors and Juniors: Please check your BSU account information and make sure your BSU dual credit account balance is paid. Otherwise, BSU will place a HOLD on your account, and you not be able to register for further dual credit courses or receive your transcript at the end of the year from BSU. You can find directions about this process on our school website at https://dhs.delcomschools.org/early_college/b_s_u_dual_credit

CLASS OF 2024: FINANCIAL AID – FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

The FAFSA is the form used for determining state and federal financial aid. You will be able to file the form online at <u>studentaid.gov</u> beginning December 2023. The exact date of the FAFSA opening for the Class of 2024 has not yet been announced, but the website currently states it will open "by December 31, 2023." The Indiana filing deadline is April 15, 2024. However, *many colleges* in Indiana have an earlier deadline, both for admission and/or for scholarship consideration - so check with the college/s of your choice for their specific deadline. The FAFSA is completed using "prior prior" year taxes. For the Class of 2024, that will be 2022 tax information.

Due a new law in Indiana, starting with the Class of 2024, all Seniors are "required" to file a FAFSA by April 15, 2024. Meanwhile, the FAFSA itself has changed! Therefore, Delta is offering multiple opportunities to assist parents and students. Please take note of these dates and plan accordingly.

MUNCIE AREA CAREER CENTER (MACC)

On **November 14th**, all 10th grade students and interested 11th grade students had the opportunity to hear a presentation about the Muncie Area Career Center (MACC) during their SRT. MACC's various programs and opportunities were explained. Students received a MACC Magazine detailing each program.

Students may apply to attend MACC for their Junior and/or Senior year. Programs are offered in the AM and PM. The Online MACC Application is due February 1, 2024, to Mrs. Calloway or Mr. Spaulding. 2nd year MACC students are also required to submit an Online MACC Application. MACC Session in the AM (Periods 1, 2, 3)

Students need to provide their own transportation to MACC in the AM and back to DHS. Students take classes at DHS for Periods 4, 5, 6, and 7.

MACC Session in the PM (Periods 5, 6, 7)

Students may ride the provided transportation to and from MACC in the PM. Students take classes at DHS for Periods 1, 2, and 3.

College Representatives at Delta High School

College Admission Counselors visiting Delta High School. Be sure to listen to the announcements and sign up to speak with the college/s of your interest.

College Visits

- Visit college campuses when college is in session to get a feel for the campus
- Seniors are allowed TWO excused absences for College Visits; Juniors are allowed ONE.
- Complete the College Visit Form and return it to Mrs. Jackson. Directions and the Form are posted in the Class of 2024 and Class of 2025 Canvas

College Admission TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

- Senior Transcripts will be submitted electronically via their Parchment account, or via their Common Application account
- Please DO NOT submit a request for a transcript via Parchment if you are using the Common Application site to apply for that specific college.
- Any Senior who still needs their Parchment Code to set up their Parchment account, should see Mr. Spaulding.
- www.parchment.com/register
- If a college requires a Secondary School Report, please let Mrs. Calloway or Mr. Spaulding know. Not all colleges require this.

College Admission Applications

- Seniors should submit College Admission Applications by the deadlines set forth by your prospective colleges. Many colleges have early deadlines for scholarship awards based on admission application information. These deadlines and scholarship information will be posted on the college websites.
- Be sure to check if your college requires your SAT or ACT scores directly from the testing company. If it does, go into your SAT or ACT account and request to have your scores sent to your college.
- As long as you indicated to have your SAT or ACT scores sent to Delta High School when you took the SAT or ACT, we will have those scores on your transcript. If you are close to your college admission deadline when you take the test, you should indicate to have the scores sent directly to the college, since scores will arrive faster to your college that way.
- Many colleges are now "test optional." This means you may apply for admission without an SAT or ACT test score. Know your college admission requirements. Check their websites.

21st Century Scholars

Senior Scholars and Parents/Guardians: It is now time to finish your grade level activities for your Scholar Success Program. You may find these activities at https://learnmoreindiana.org/scholars/ Create and/or Login to your Scholar Track Account to complete these activities. Part of your initial PLEDGE was to graduate with a minimum GPA of 6.5/12, graduate with at least a Core 40 Diploma, file the FAFSA on time, and complete all 12 activities of the Scholar Success Program. One of these activities requires you to take the SAT or ACT. If you do not complete these activities, you will not receive this Scholarship. You may contact the 21st Century Student Support Center at 1-888-528-4719 with questions regarding your account login information.

Junior, Sophomore, and Freshmen Scholars and Parents/Guardians: It is now time to complete your grade level activities for your Scholar Success Program. You may find these activities at https://learnmoreindiana.org/scholars/ Create and/or Login to your Scholar Track Account to complete these activities. You may contact the 21st Century Student Support Center at 1-888-528-4719 with questions regarding your account login information.

NCAA / NAIA – Are You Planning to be in a Sport in College?

Juniors and Seniors and Parents/Guardians: If you are planning to play athletics at the college level, register with NCAA and/or NAIA by the end of your Senior year. Spend time on these sites to know their specific qualifications. Consult with parents/guardians and determine which site/s are best for your goals. There are Course Requirements, GPA Requirements, and SAT/ACT Requirements all outlined on these sites. It is your responsibility to be sure you are on the right track for your desired path. Let Mrs. Kunda know once you have registered.

Do NOT delay with this process. If you do not complete this process by the end of your Senior year, you run the risk of not being eligible to begin practice with ANY sport at college.



Go to studentaid.gov and click "Create account" then "Get Started".

Enter your Name, Date of birth, and Social Security Number.

Username: Choose something you will remember and hasn't already been taken.
 Note: You will see a message that says "Username Available" or "Username Taken" once you meet the minimum field requirements.
 Email: Must be personal and unique to the individual creating the ID and unique to the account owner.
 Password: Choose something you will remember that meets the password criteria and minimum field requirements.

What is the FAFSA?

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the most important document for getting money to help your student pay for college. Financial aid is the term used for that money. It comes in the form of grants, scholarships and loans.

To enroll in college in fall 2024, your student will file the 2024-2025 FAFSA. That FAFSA will open in December 2023. To qualify for Indiana's state financial aid, your student must file by April 15, 2024.

When it is time to file the FAFSA, the parent(s) and their student will need to create a Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID). A *legal guardian* of a student does not.

Resources needed to create an FSA ID:

- 1. Your Social Security number (SSN)
- 2. Your full legal name
- 3. Your date of birth
- 4. Your mailing address
- 5. An e-mail address that is unique to you (personal e-mail, not work e-mail)
- 6. A memorable username and password (store them somewhere safe)

Resources needed to file the FAFSA:

- 1. Your FSA ID username and password
- 2. Your Social Security number (SSN)
- 3. (Optional) Your driver's license number
- 4. Your 2022 federal tax returns, if applicable (IRS forms 1040, 1040EZ or 1040A)
- 5. The 2022 federal tax returns for your student (if applicable) (IRS forms 1040, 1040EZ or 1040A)
- 6. Records of money earned, including W-2 forms and recent bank statements
- 7. Alien registration numbers or permanent residence cards, if you are not a U.S. citizen
- 8. Six-digit FAFSA codes for any institutions your student is applying to. Use these codes to send your student's FAFSA information to the colleges. Your student will be able to add up to 20 colleges at a time. Find the FAFSA codes at **LearnMoreIndiana.org/preadmit**. (You can also scan the QR code on the front side of this letter.)

How do I file the FAFSA?

The easiest way to file the FAFSA is online at **https://studentaid.gov/**. The website also provides a printer-friendly PDF if your student prefers to mail their FAFSA or a parent signature form is required.

During parts of the year, there are two FAFSAs open at the same time. Make sure that your student files the 2024-25 FAFSA.
