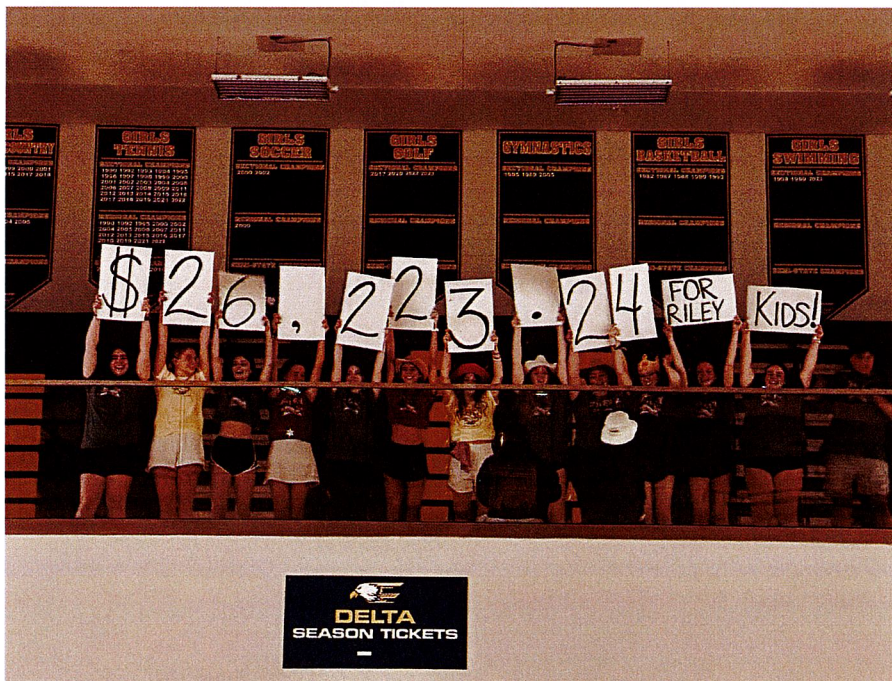

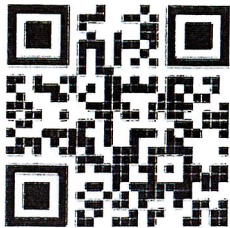

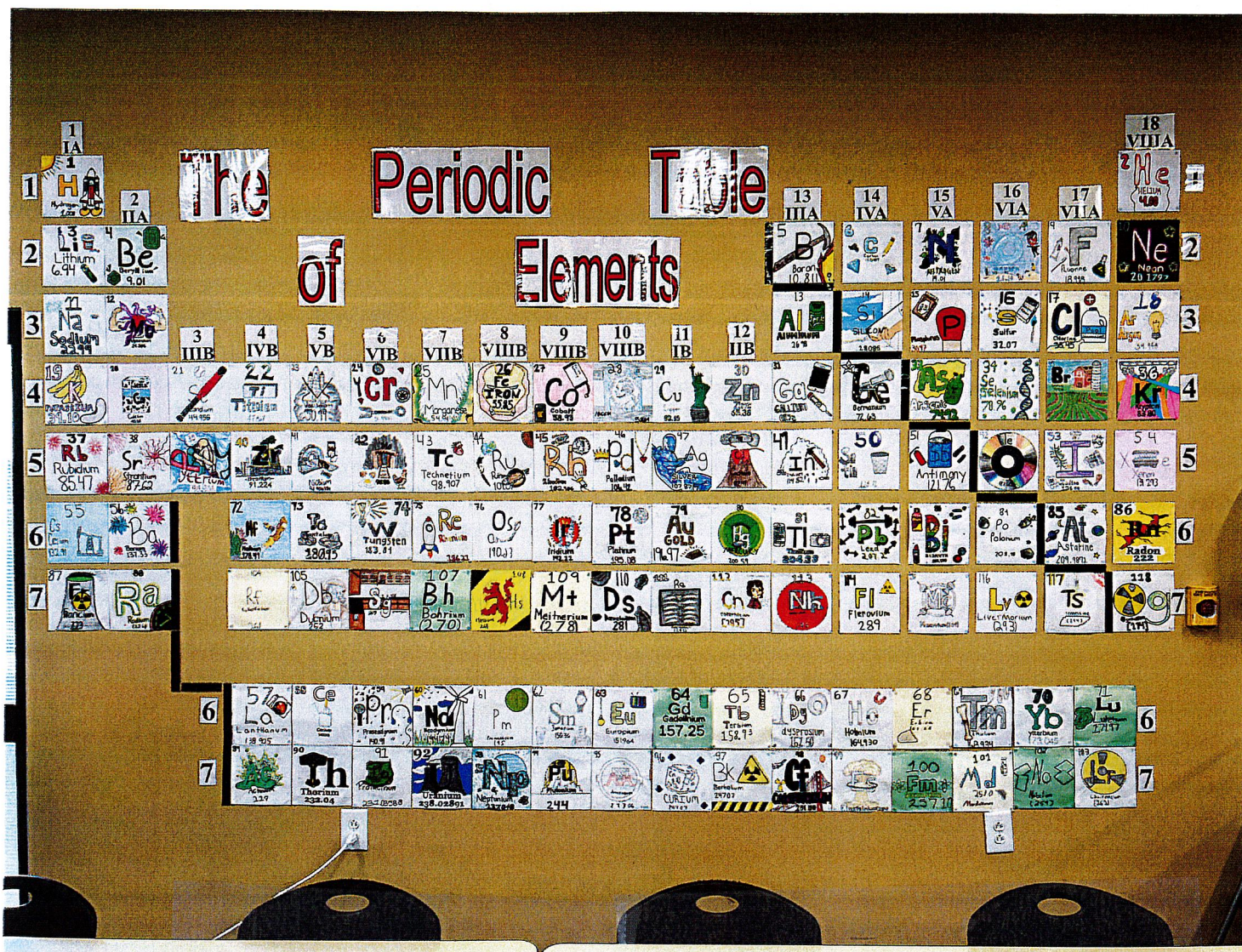

Every year Mr. May's ICP student are responsible for choosing 3 elements that they research and design "element tiles" for. Their element tiles are to include an element's atomic number, atomic symbol, full name, and atomic mass. The students also have to include some kind of design aspect that give onlookers an idea of how the element is utilized, its physical attributes, or something about it's history. Student's goals include creating tiles that are fully accurate, clear, and have designs that are relevant to the element. 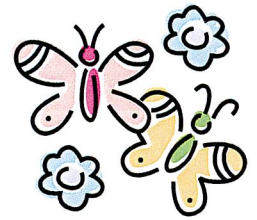
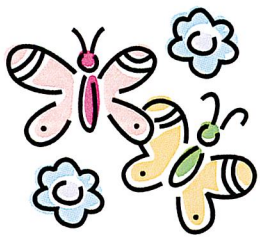
Art news...



Our inspiration came from the Pop Artist, Claes Oldenburg, where the class focused on his soft sculptures from his "store" exhibit in Manhattan. Pop art is a style of art based on simple, bold images of everyday items, such as soup cans, painted in bright colors. The movement was meant to be a challenge to "traditional" art.

Oldenburg, created giant soft sculptures into the shapes of food stuffed with recycled materials, such as milk cartons. Our class also utilized recyclable materials such as used store bags and newspapers to fill the sculptures. Students challenged their thoughts on the scaling of objects and how it can change a viewer's perspective.

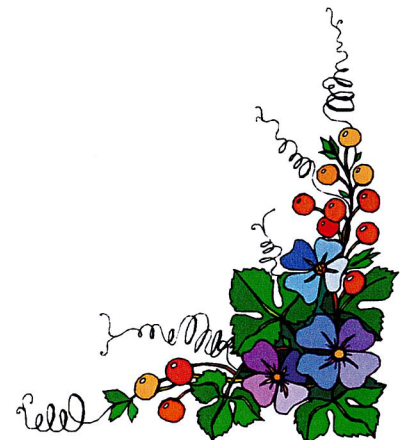
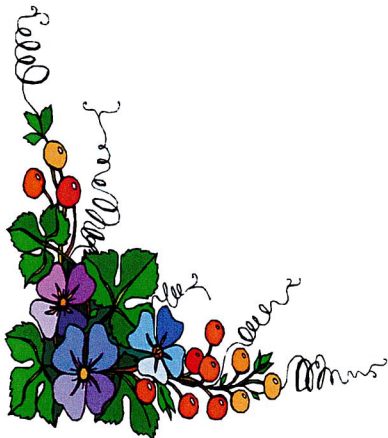

CLASS OF 2024: FINANCIAL AID – FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)

The FAFSA is the form used for determining state and federal financial aid. You may file the form online at studentaid.gov. The 2024-2025 FAFSA is now officially open. The Indiana filing deadline is April 15, 2024. However, *many colleges* in Indiana have an earlier deadline, both for admission and/or for scholarship consideration - so check with the college/s of your choice for their specific deadline. The FAFSA is completed using “prior prior” year taxes. For the Class of 2024, that will be 2022 tax information.

Due a new law in Indiana, starting with the Class of 2024, all Seniors are “required” to file a FAFSA by April 15, 2024. Meanwhile, the FAFSA itself has changed! Therefore, Delta is offering multiple opportunities to assist parents and students. Please take note of these dates and plan accordingly.

- Parents and Seniors: Obtain your FSA ID now. Go to StudentAid.gov to create your unique FSA ID. This number acts as your signature on the FAFSA.
- Please see the **attached Create your FSA ID** instructions & the **attached FAFSA Checklist** to assist in this process. Seniors, these papers are also available on the table outside the Main Office and in your Class of 2024 FAFSA Module.

ONLINE END OF YEAR SENIOR SURVEYS

Seniors: Please check your Class of 2024 Canvas Module titled **Senior Surveys** and complete the 2 posted online Senior Surveys.

1. **Senior Award & Scholarship Survey must be completed by April 9.** This allows us to be able to recognize you for your accomplishments and any scholarships received. If you don't complete this Survey, then we don't know!! IF you are a 21st Century Scholar, and you have met the pledge requirements (Core40, GPA 6.5 or higher, completed 12 activities including the FAFSA), and you want to be recognized for this scholarship, please include it in your survey list. If you do NOT include it, we will take that as a sign that you prefer NOT to be recognized for this particular scholarship.
2. **Senior Final Transcript & Future Plan Survey must be completed by May 10.** This Survey will let us know where to send your Final Delta Transcript and what your future plans are. This information is required for state reporting, and we want to be able to Celebrate your next steps with you!

We need all Seniors completing these 2 Surveys! Don't delay.

CLASS OF 2024 CANVAS: 2023-2024 SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION MODULE

Scholarships will be listed on the Class of 2024 Canvas. Students should check the Scholarship Module on a regular basis for updates and follow all directions specific to the Scholarship. Website links and Applications will be posted on the respective Canvas Scholarship page. There are now scholarships posted for students with Technical/Trade college, 2 year college, and 4 year college post-secondary plans. Please work ahead on these scholarships so that you are able to submit by their respective deadlines.

SENIOR FINAL COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

- Seniors are responsible to place a Final Transcript Request in Parchment. You must select the **HOLD** option in the drop down box of when to send it out. Otherwise, your request will be processed before final grades are completed.
- **Final Transcripts are generally not ready to send to colleges until mid-June.** Please plan accordingly with your colleges. Don't schedule course selection meetings until that time if a Final Transcript is going to be needed at the appointment.

BSU DUAL CREDIT INFORMATION

Seniors and Juniors: Please check your BSU account information and make sure your BSU dual credit account balance is paid. Otherwise, BSU will place a HOLD on your account, and you not be able to register for further dual credit courses or receive your transcript at the end of the year from BSU.

College Admission TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

- Senior Transcripts will be submitted electronically via their Parchment account, or via their Common Application account
- Please DO NOT submit a request for a transcript via Parchment if you are using the Common Application site to apply for that specific college.
- Any Senior who still needs their Parchment Code to set up their Parchment account, should see Mr. Spaulding.

- If a college requires a Secondary School Report, please let Mrs. Calloway or Mr. Spaulding know. Not all colleges require this.

College Admission Applications

- Seniors should submit College Admission Applications by the deadlines set forth by your prospective colleges. Many colleges have early deadlines for scholarship awards based on admission application information. These deadlines and scholarship information will be posted on the college websites.
- Be sure to check if your college requires your SAT or ACT scores directly from the testing company. If it does, go into your SAT or ACT account and request to have your scores sent to your college.
- Many colleges are now "test optional." This means you may apply for admission without an SAT or ACT test score. Know your college admission requirements. Check their websites

21st Century Scholars

Senior Scholars and Parents/Guardians: It is now time to finish your grade level activities for your Scholar Success Program. You may find these activities at <https://learnmoreindiana.org/scholars/> Create and/or Login to your Scholar Track Account to complete these activities. Part of your initial PLEDGE was to graduate with a minimum GPA of 6.5/12, graduate with at least a Core 40 Diploma, file the FAFSA on time, and complete all 12 activities of the Scholar Success Program. One of these activities requires you to take the SAT or ACT. If you do not complete these activities, you will not receive this Scholarship. NCAA / NAIA – Are You Planning to be in a Sport in College?

Juniors and Seniors and Parents/Guardians: If you are planning to play athletics at the college level, register with NCAA and/or NAIA by the end of your Senior year. Spend time on these sites to know their specific qualifications. Consult with parents/guardians and determine which site/s are best for your goals. There are Course Requirements, GPA Requirements, and SAT/ACT Requirements all outlined on these sites. **It is your responsibility to be sure you are on the right track, including all the courses taken and passed for your desired Division path.**

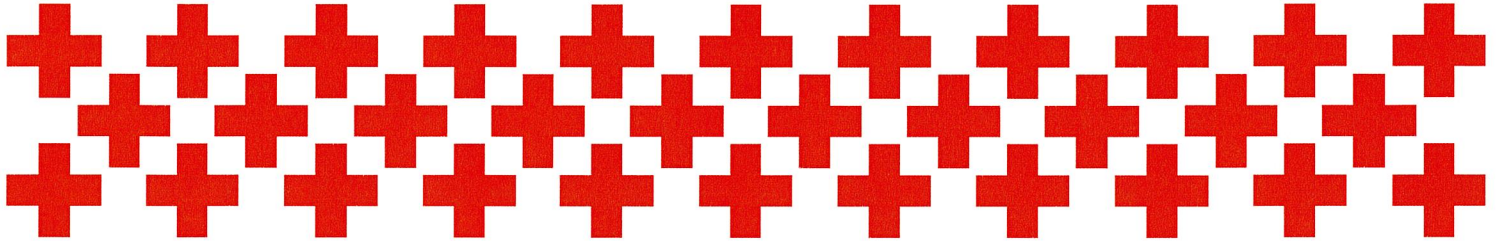

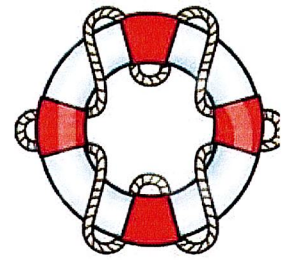

Cost: \$200. (total cost for the full lifeguarding class) \$120 (cost for the review lifeguarding class)

To register: The class is a blended learning class where the students view 7 hrs. of online Red Cross videos and various education materials online. The students then receive 20 hours of water time, Lifeguarding skills, CPR & first aid instruction with the instructors. All Participants MUST register for the class online at RedCrosslearningcenter.org. **Only register online once I contact you and tell you that you are in the class & not before. The Registration Link will be emailed to you once you email Laura Caudill at LSeibold@bsu.edu** Once you receive the link to register for the Lifeguarding Course you will need to create a profile in the Learning Center prior to registering for the course. For best results, type the full registration link I will be emailing you. By doing so, you will be taken to the specific class associated with the link once you log in. Once again you will create a Profile on the Red Cross site and then register for the class. You can then download the Lifeguarding book and start the online education videos. Please do this as soon as you can. It is 7 hours of videos and questions followed up with the CPR written exam. You must print the completion certificate or screenshot of your passing page and email it to me before meeting the class on the start date of your class. This must be completed prior to the in-person class.

What to Bring to Class: Swimsuit, towel, swim goggles are optional, pocket mask for CPR and rescue breathing (this can be purchased at the Ball State bookstores or online (usually under \$15).

To be eligible to take this class you must meet the following: You must be 15 years old or older by the last day of the class. **Swimming Pre-requisites:** 300 yd. continuous swim, tread water for 2 min., timed brick retrieval from deep water. **If you are not sure of your swimming ability, contact the instructors before you register for the class since the Red Cross registration fee is not refundable.** Swimming tests can be done the week before class on an arranged basis at Delta.

Lifeguarding Review ***If you have already had a lifeguarding class** and your certification is ready to expire you can take the Lifeguarding Review class to become recertified which is shorter & cheaper. **The Lifeguarding Review class will be held 9am--5:30pm on the Sunday April 14, or April 21, or May 5.** Contact us if this may be your situation. The Review or recertification class is \$120. Your lifeguarding can only have expired 90 days or less.
